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Prayer of the Day

Let us pray,

A brief silence is kept before the prayer.

God of deliverance,

Daniel resisted earthly power and instead reflected your power, the power you reveal to us in Jesus Christ. Help us to refuse the powers that threaten to separate us from worshiping or following Jesus. Guide us in the ways that reflect the Light of the World. For the sake of the one who made your name known to all people, across land and sea, Jesus Christ, our redeemer. Amen.

The Word

To the Narrator: please tell the congregation what their parts are before announcing the reading. Also, go over any pronunciations they might have that could be difficult.

Narrator: Our story and God's story continues today in the reading is from the book of Daniel, the 6th chapter, from The Message translation of the Bible.

ALL: Glory to you, O Lord.

NARRATOR: Darius reorganized his kingdom. He appointed one hundred twenty governors to administer all the parts of his realm. Over them were three vice-regents, one of whom was Daniel. The governors reported to the vice-regents, who made sure that everything was in order for the king. But Daniel, brimming with spirit and intelligence, so completely outclassed the other vice-regents and governors that the king decided to put him in charge of the whole kingdom. The vice-regents and governors got together to find some old scandal or skeleton in Daniel's life that they could use against him, but they couldn't dig up anything. He was totally exemplary and trustworthy. They could find no evidence of negligence or misconduct. So they finally gave up and said,

(voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "We're never going to find anything against this Daniel unless we can cook up something religious."

NARRATOR: The vice-regents and governors conspired together and then went to the king and said, (voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "King Darius, live forever! We've convened your vice-regents, governors, and all your leading officials, and have agreed that the king should issue the following decree:

ALL: For the next thirty days no one is to pray to any god or mortal except you, O king. Anyone who disobeys will be thrown into the lions' den.

(voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "Issue this decree, O king, and make it unconditional, as if written in stone like all the laws of the Medes and the Persians."

NARRATOR: King Darius signed the decree. When Daniel learned that the decree had been signed and posted, he continued to pray just as he had always done. His house had windows in the upstairs that opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he knelt there in prayer, thanking and praising his God. The conspirators came and found him praying, asking God for help. They went straight to the king and reminded him of the royal decree that he had signed.

(voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "Did you not," they said, "sign a decree forbidding anyone to pray to any god or man except you for the next thirty days? And anyone caught doing it would be thrown into the lions' den?"

(voice 2) KING DARIUS: "Absolutely! Written in stone, like all the laws of the Medes and Persians."

(voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "Daniel, one of the Jewish exiles, ignores you, O king, and defies your decree. Three times a day he prays."

NARRATOR: At this, the king was very upset and tried his best to get Daniel out of the fix he'd put him in. He worked at it the whole day long. But then the conspirators were back:

(voice 1) VICE REGENTS & GOVERNORS: "Remember, O king, it's the law of the Medes and Persians that the king's decree can never be changed."

NARRATOR: The king caved in and ordered Daniel brought and thrown into the lions' den. But he said to Daniel,

(voice 2) KING DARIUS: "Your God, to whom you are so loyal, is going to get you out of this."

NARRATOR: A stone slab was placed over the opening of the den. The king sealed the cover with his signet ring and the signet rings of all his nobles, fixing Daniel's fate. The king then went back to his palace. He refused supper. He couldn't sleep. He spent the night fasting. At daybreak the king got up and hurried to the lions' den. As he approached the den, he called out anxiously,

(voice 2) KING DARIUS: "Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve so loyally, saved you from the lions?"

DANIEL: O king, live forever! My God sent his angel, who closed the mouths of the lions so that they would not hurt me. I've been found innocent before God and also before you, O king. I've done nothing to harm you."

NARRATOR: When the king heard these words, he was happy. He ordered Daniel taken up out of the den. When he was hauled up, there wasn't a scratch on him. He had trusted his God. Then the king commanded that the conspirators who had informed on Daniel be thrown into the lions' den, along with their wives and children. Before they hit the floor, the lions had them in their jaws, tearing them to pieces. King Darius published this proclamation to every race, color, and creed on earth:

ALL: Peace to you! Abundant peace!

I decree that Daniel's God shall be worshiped and feared in all parts of my kingdom.

He is the living God, world without end. His kingdom never falls.

His rule continues eternally.

He is a savior and rescuer.

He performs astonishing miracles in heaven and on earth.

He saved Daniel from the power of the lions.

NARRATOR: From then on, Daniel was treated well during the reign of Darius, and also in the following reign of Cyrus the Persian.

NARRATOR: Stay tuned for the continuing drama that is our story and God's story.

ALL: Praise to you O Christ.



Setting the Table

As the kids help set the table, they make a circle around the table and lead the congregation in the table prayer written by Martin Luther:

Let's pray: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest. And let these gifts to us be blest. Blest be God who is our bread, may all the world be clothed and fed. Amen.

In thanksgiving for these gifts, let us pray: Generous God, you remember us and return to us again and again. In response to your love and faithfulness to us, we offer these financial gifts, we offer our lives - all gifts from you. Amen.

Confession

Now ready to welcomed at Christ's table, let us first confess that God is God and we are not. God of light,

We confess that we have not loved our sisters and our brothers.

We have not looked to your kingdom, but have looked to building our own.

We want more and more and we want bigger and better.

We have squeezed the margins until there is nothing left.

Forgive us for not looking to your kingdom that is coming,

that encompasses all, that is not full of things, but full of life and the promise of hope.

Your kingdom includes all of creation, all people, all of our sisters and brothers whom we have squeezed out. Forgive us. Call us to open our tightly clenched fists, to let go of what we have been holding onto, and allow your kingdom, your love, to be our life.

Assurance of Forgiveness

God is doing something new, and it won't look anything like we want it to. It's how God works best. God will lead us through, transform our lives, forgive long before we ever do. God does not define you as the things you've done but as a Child of God. Trust in God: You are forgiven. As far as the east is from the west, so far God removes your sin from you. God will see you through to the new kingdom, into new life. **Thanks be to God. Amen.**

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence. Come, Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer You are invited to join hands with those around you in prayer. If you are not the hand-holding type, then simply fold your hands in front of you or hang onto this bulletin as you pray.

Jesus, remember us, and teach us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


Invitation to the Meal

Come, be re-united and re-membered at Christ's table.


