The call I have to be a pastor and, specifically, to be *your* pastor, is such a gift. I love our purpose for existing, I love the ways that we practice being a community, I love how you love each other, love the community, love me, and most critically, love God. It's what this is all about - communicating the love of God through Christ Jesus to everyone. It is why we exist!
