NARRATOR: The gospel reading is from Mark 6:1-13.

He left that place and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said,

He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. He said to them,

**ALL: “Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.”**

NARRATOR: So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.




