





The Story – Rapid River Players

During the season of Lent, the story will be told, read and even acted out by River of Hope-ers. Lean in and see if you can see yourself in the story.

Narrator: Today, God's backstory and our backstory meet in Matthew 25:31-46. **Glory to you O Lord.**

Jesus: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand,

King: 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

Jesus: Then the righteous will answer him,

Righteous: 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?'

Jesus: And the king will answer them,

King: 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'

Jesus: Then he will say to those at his left hand,

King: 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.'

Jesus: Then they also will answer,

Accursed: 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?'

Jesus: Then he will answer them,

King: 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.'

Jesus: And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." Narrator: Stay tuned for the continuing backstory that mixes together our backstory with God's. **Praise be to God!**

The Rite of Holy Baptism

Presentation

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Sponsors and parents:

We present Clara Kay Huseby for baptism.

Parents and Sponsors, as you bring <u>Clara</u> to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with <u>her</u> among God's faithful people, bring <u>her</u> to the word of God and the holy supper, teach <u>her</u> the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in <u>her</u> hands the holy scriptures, and nurture <u>her</u> in faith and prayer, so that <u>she</u> may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help <u>Clara</u> grow in the Christian faith and life? **I do.**

<u>Sponsors & Parents</u>, do you promise to nurture <u>Clara</u> in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help <u>her</u> live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

I do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

<u>People of God</u>, do you promise to support <u>Clara</u> and pray for <u>her</u> in <u>her</u> new life in Christ?

We do.

Please stand.

Profession of Faith

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried;

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.

Thanksgiving at the Font

The Lord is with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Holy God, holy and merciful, holy and mighty, you are the river of life, you are the everlasting wellspring, you are the fire of rebirth.

Glory to you for oceans and lakes, for rivers and streams. Honor to you for cloud and rain, for dew and snow. Your waters are below us, around us, above us: our life is born in you. You are the fountain of resurrection.

Praise to you for your saving waters: Noah and the animals survive the flood, Hagar discovers your well. The Israelites escape through the sea, and they drink from your gushing rock. Naaman washes his leprosy away, Jesus was born from a watery womb, and the Samaritan woman will never be thirsty again.

At this font, holy God, we pray: Praise to you for the water of baptism and for your Word that saves us in this water. Breathe your Spirit into all who are gathered here and into all creation. Illumine our days. Enliven our bones. Dry our tears. Wash away the sin within us, and drown the evil around us.

Satisfy all our thirst with your living water, Jesus Christ, our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Please be seated.

Baptism

<u>Clara Kay Huseby</u>, you are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized.

Alleluia.

Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your child, Clara, new birth, cleanse her from sin, and raise her to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of each of the newly baptized, the minister prays: Sustain <u>Clara</u> with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the newly baptized and says:

<u>Clara Kay Huseby</u>, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen**

Welcome

A lighted candle is given to the newly baptized (to a sponsor of a young child) as a representative of the congregation says:

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Let us welcome Clara.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the purpose we share: we go out to transform lives through Jesus Christ. Clara, welcome to a life of giving thanks and praise to God joining us in being light to God's creative and redeeming word to all the world. Amen.

THE FEAST

Setting the Table

As the kids help set the table, make a circle around the table and lead the congregation in the table prayer written by Martin Luther:

Let's pray: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest. And let these gifts to us be blest. Blest be God who is our bread, may all the world be clothed and fed. Amen.

Invitation to Communion

People of God, people with backstories. We gather as a holy communion, for a meal that has been shared countless times, in countless places, and in countless ways.

The first time this meal was shared, Jesus was gathered around a table with a ragged collection of people, all who had backstories: outcasts, betrayers, the power hungry, the fragile, lonely, lost.

The first time this meal was celebrated, Jesus promised that it was for all time, that whenever the bread was broken and the wine was poured, wherever the story was told around a table, he would be there.

Today we remember the story as it's been told a thousand times over. We eat the bread, and we drink the wine, and we affirm that because God is God and we are not, we are all welcome at this table.

So, if we come to this table angry,

Let this bread and wine be our peace.

brief silence

If we come to this table broken,

Let this bread and wine be our grace.

brief silence

If we come to the table betrayed,

Let this bread and wine be our wholeness.

brief silence

If we come to the table in despair,

Let this bread and wine be our hope.

brief silence

This is the table of forgiveness and mercy. Come and lay your backstory here. All is forgiven.

Thanks be to God.

When Jesus ate with his friends,

He took bread, and after blessing it,

He broke it and gave it to them saying:

"Take, eat; this is my body given for you.

Each time you do this, remember me."

Then he took the cup, and after giving thanks, passed it to his friends, saying:

"Drink. This cup poured out for you and for all people is the promise of God.

Whenever you drink it, remember me."

We remember Jesus' death and resurrection, our hope and our life. We break the bread and share the one cup.

Thanks be to God.

You are welcome to this meal. It is free and it is for you. If you hunger and thirst for grace and mercy that comes through Jesus Christ, then Christ has set this table just for you.



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
Final Blessing


