As we light this second candle on our Advent wreath, we pause to name the sorrow and suffering of all of creation. For lost jobs and lost relationships, for food insecurity and financial instability, for ongoing racism and injustice in our community and around the world. For forests and fields devastated by fire, and communities and countryside upturned by storm. God of hope, **draw near**

Silence

As we light this third candle on our Advent wreath, we pause to name the weariness of our world. Around our community and across the globe, healthcare workers, teachers, scientists, food and sanitation workers, and all essential employees are working tirelessly to care for this world and to bring an end to this ongoing pandemic. We are restless thinking about health and safety, we are lonely, hungry, weary, and afraid. God of hope, **draw near**.

Silence.

As we light this fourth candle on our Advent wreath, we pause to give space for all that we have not yet named aloud but that which fills our heart this night with longing. God of hope, **draw near**.
