Meet Someone New

THE STORY

Narrator: Our story and God's story continues today, with a reading from Psalm 27.

Narrator: The Lord is my light and my salvation;

whom shall I fear?

All: The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

Narrator: When evildoers assail me

to devour my flesh—

my adversaries and foes—

they shall stumble and fall.

All: Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war rise up against me, yet I will be confident.

Narrator: One thing I asked of the Lord,

that will I seek after:

to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life,

to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in his temple.

All: For he will hide me in his shelter

in the day of trouble;

he will conceal me under the cover of his tent;

he will set me high on a rock.

Narrator: Now my head is lifted up above my enemies all around me,

and I will offer in his tent sacrifices with shouts of joy;

I will sing and make melody to the Lord.

All: Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud, be gracious to me and answer me!

Narrator: "Come," my heart says, "seek his face!"

Your face, Lord, do I seek.

All: Do not hide your face from me.

Narrator: Do not turn your servant away in anger, you who have been my help.

All: Do not cast me off, do not forsake me, O God of my salvation!

Narrator: If my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will take me up.

All: Teach me your way, O Lord, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies.

Narrator: Do not give me up to the will of my adversaries, for false witnesses have risen against me, and they are breathing out violence.

All: I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.

Narrator: Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!

Narrator: Stay tuned for the continuing drama that is our story and God's story.

All: Praise to you O Christ.

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 6th chapter.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Matthew 6:25-34

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? ²⁸ And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³¹ Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' ³² For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. ³³ But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

³⁴ "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today."






