**Forgive us for our frayed ends and self-centered hearts.**

**Unravel the sin in us and replace it with love. Gratefully we pray, Amen.**

In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the ✝ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**







**Keep us on the path of Wisdom, away from wicked tyranny; Spirit ever breathe through us, empower us with hope.**

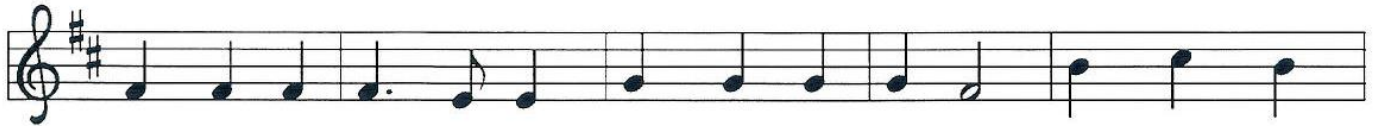
**From you, through you and in you, are all things, now and always; to you be all honor and praise. Amen.**

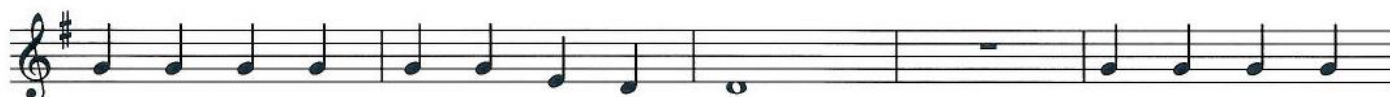
