Advent Candle Litany: Peace Candle

Throughout the Advent season, use this litany with one, two, or multiple readers, or a call and response with the congregation.

Reader One: Just as John the Baptist saw a world of violence, injustice, and oppression, so we too see the failure of those in power to do justice in this war-torn world.

Reader Two: But God sent John to witness to the light of peace, preparing the way for Jesus, who would call us to bring harmony and justice in places of discord and strife.

Reader One: (*light candle 1*) We light first the candle of hope, trusting that hope for a savior remains.

Reader Two: (*light candle 2*) And we light the second, believing that God's Son might usher in a new order, where lion and lamb lie peacefully together.

Confession and Forgiveness

Let us confess that God is God and we are not.

Silence for reflection.

Creator God,

we admit we are not always loving and kind. Forgive us for the words we say and things we do that hurt other people. It feels impossible to fathom, but we know you love everyone. Everyone. Even the ones who hurt us. Make room in us for your forgiveness. Show us how to forgive those who are mean to us. Give us your power to forgive the ones who hurt us. Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF FORGIVENESS

God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love – loves you as you are. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ and by his authority, I declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your in in the name of the Holy Trinity – God, Jesus, Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Greeting

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the community of the Holy Spirit is with you all. **And also with you**.

Prayer of the Day Let us pray together, Mighty God,

(ALL): You sent John the Baptist as a voice to call your people to repentance. May his words ring in our hearts as well as our ears, that we might turn to you and receive your promised Savior. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

THE STORY

(Reader): Our story and God's story begins today, with a reading from Philippians 1: verses 3-11.

(Reader): The apostle Paul was the pastor of many new churches. He writes in this letter about his joy to be in partnership with the Christians of Philippi. Listen to how tender-hearted Paul, sometimes a stern preacher, is with his friends as he encourages them to grow in love and knowledge.

(Reader): ³I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. ⁸For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus.

- (Side 1): ⁹And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight
- (Side 2): 10 to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless,
- (ALL): ¹¹having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

(Reader): Our story and God's story continues today, with a reading from Luke 3: verses 1-6.

(Reader): John the Baptist is a herald of Jesus, whose way is prepared by "repentance for the forgiveness of sins." As we hear the careful record of human leaders, we sense the spectrum of political and religious authority that will be challenged by this coming Lord.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, ²during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. ³He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, ⁴as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

(Side 1): "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.

(Side 2): ⁵Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight,

(ALL): and the rough ways made smooth; 'and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"

(Reader): Stay tuned for the continuing saga that is our story and God's story.

ALL: Thanks be to God.


The Sending
