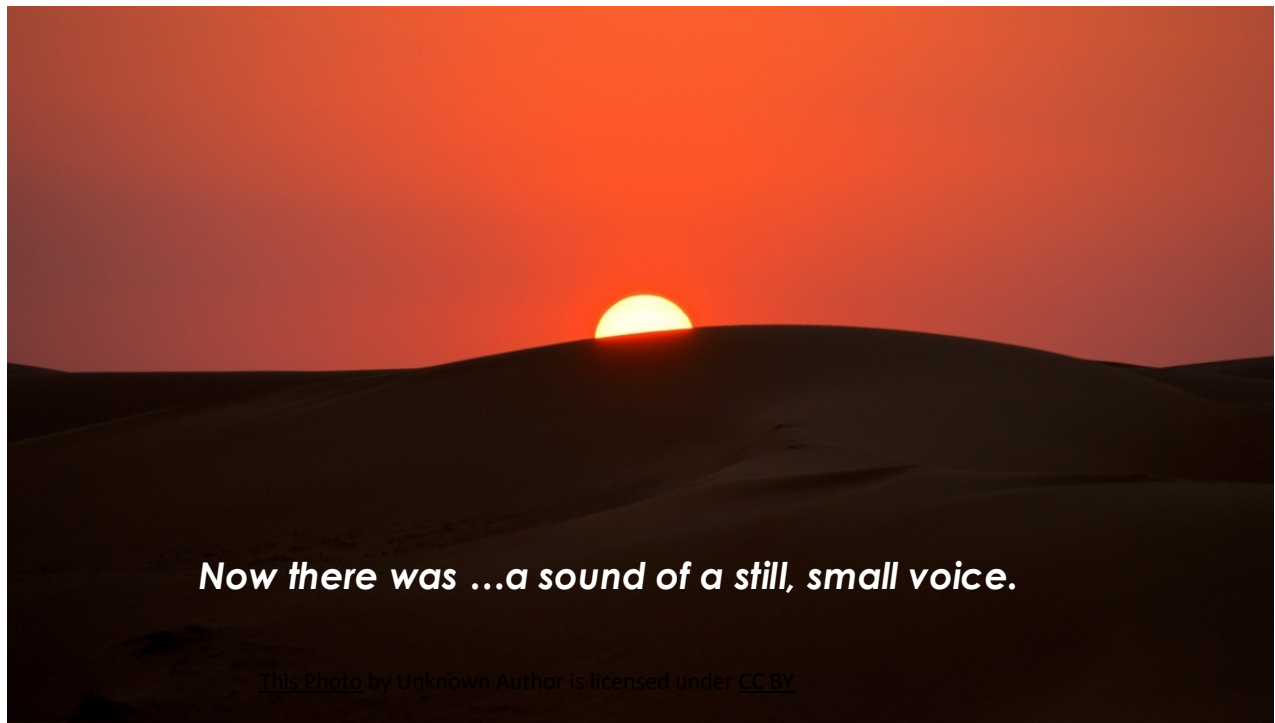

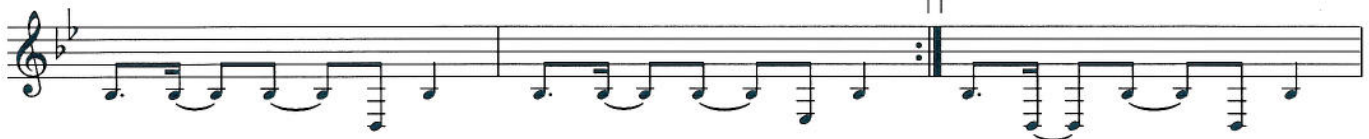

(Reader): *Our story and God's story continues today with a reading from the Book of First Kings chapter 9, verses 9-13a.*

(Reader): *At that place he came to a cave, and spent the night there. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying,*






