(Reader): Our story and God's story continues today with two readings. First, a reading from Romans chapter 5, verses 1-5.

(Side 2): "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom belonged to this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from

being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here."

(Reader): Pilate asked him,

(Side 1): "So you are a king?"

(Reader): Jesus answered,

(Side 2): "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

The Lord's Prayer


We pray our common prayer that Christ taught us.

Prayer after Communion



The blessing of God, who provides for us, feeds us, and journeys with us + be upon you now and forever. **Amen.**


