River Table Meeting April 11, 2023

The River Table of River of Hope Lutheran Church (RoH) met, via Zoom, on April 11, 2023. Present was Pastor Hans, Katie Weisenberger, president, Sandy Tracy, vice-president, Arlyln DeBruyckere, treasurer, Nancy Redetzke, Nina Appleby, Andy Shorter, and Jeanette Krommenhoek. Gerry Connell, the secretary, was not present.

Pastor Hans opened the meeting with prayer and a discussion on the familiar phrase, "Peace Be With You." The group spoke about this phrase, what it means to us and when do we use it in our everyday lives.

The minutes from the March 2023 meeting were approved via a motion by Jeanette, second by Nina followed by a unanimous vote.

The financial report was presented by Arlyn. Currently there is a small deficit driven by the purchase of Kwik Trip Cards. Upon the sale of the cards the deficit should be eliminated. Arlyn has no concerns about the budget.

Discussion was held regarding the reimbursement of travel expenses for Sara Thomsen. There was a motion by Sandy, second by Katie followed by a unanimous vote to approve this expense. River table members agreed that there should be a protocol for payment of this type of expense. Pastor Hans will review past practices.

Pastor Hans presented the pastor's report. One of his goals is to try and build a sense of community for all who participate at RoH.

- Pastor is encouraged by the number of youth who will be attending various camps throughout the summer as well as the adults who will be accompanying the campers.
- Katie's leadership of Headwaters has been invaluable. Hans sees this growing in experiences and number of participants.
- Pastor challenges everyone to reach out to one or two or more to attend the upcoming concert by Sara Thomsen.

The We Go Out table will have a meeting later this month to discuss future activities. In the meantime, the Hopeful Quilters, Hopeful People, Back Pack program, and Watering Can projects continue to reach out to the community.

Vision Table report was reviewed. This table continues to discern if RoH wants to be a Reconciling in Christ congregation; do we appear to others as we want; signage; visuals in printed materials, social media, etc.

- We'd also like to create a new welcome statement that would be on our website and Facebook page to be more inclusive. We are each encouraged to create our own or revise our old statement and be ready to share our ideas at the next meeting. Examples of other churches' welcome statements were handed out at the meeting. Hans emailed those out as well.
