

Psalm 139 (mashup of the NRSV and "The Message")

A Please join us in reading the Psalm 139 responsively. We will read the leader parts, please read the bold part responsively.

O LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away.

GOD, investigate my life; get all the facts firsthand. I'm an open book to you;

even from a distance, you know what I'm thinking.

B You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways.

Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely.

You know when I leave and when I get back; I'm never out of your sight.

You know everything I'm going to say before I start the first sentence.

A Where can I go from your spirit?

Or where can I flee from your presence?

Is there anyplace I can go to avoid your Spirit? to be out of your sight?

B If I ascend to heaven, you are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there.

If I climb to the sky, you're there! If I go underground, you're there!

A If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast.

If I flew on morning's wings to the far western horizon, You'd find me in a minute— you're already there waiting!

B If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night," even the darkness is not dark to you;

the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you.

It's a fact: darkness isn't dark to you; night and day, darkness and light, they're all the same to you.

A I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well.

A Response: Word of God, word of life.




