





Greeting

L: The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the community of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

C: And also with you.

Gathering/Land Acknowledgement/Call to Worship

L: All of creation is filled with the touch of God's creative hand. This country is made up of a rich and diverse history of people who have contributed their hopes, dreams and culture to shape who we are. We recognize that some were brought here forcibly. Some arrived in search of a better life. Others still had been living here for generations.

A: We acknowledge that we gather on the traditional homelands of the Wahpekute peoples.

L: The land we stand upon is holy ground.

A: We gather to honor the Creator, and all of creation – human, animal, plant, water, wind, earth and sky. All of it belongs to God.

Communal Lament

L: In response to the ways that people have been excluded because of whom they love or how they identify or express themselves, let us confess and call out to the God who knows the depths of our sorrow and shares the grief in our hearts.

A: Come near to us. Show us the way.

L: Let us pray: O God, we lament when racism, classism, sexism, ableism, transphobia, homophobia, ableism or anything else prevents us from welcoming any of your children to this community. Thank you for your presence among us. Give us wisdom and creativity to build a resilient and just community.

A: Come near to us. Show us the way.

L: O God, we have witnessed the harm and suffering of many peoples especially those whose race, ethnicity, or immigration status cause us to prevent your beloved children from full belonging.

A: Come near to us. Show us the way.

L: Help us to remember that you see us: our troubles and grief, the broken relationships that undermine community, our weakness and lack of courage in confronting evil. You hold our pain and do not abandon us. Lead us to life in you.

A: Come near to us. Show us the way.

L: God, rise up and comfort us so we no longer have to be afraid. Lead us to trust in the hope and promise of a resilient community, with justice for the excluded and oppressed.

A: Amen!

THE STORY


(Reader): Our story and God's story continues today with two readings. You are invited to follow along in your Bibles for our first reading from Psalm 71, verses 1-6.

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(Reader): Today our second reading comes from 1 Corinthians 13: 1-13.

(Reader): If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

(Side 1): Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude.

(Side 2): It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth.

(ALL): Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

(Reader): Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end.

(Side 1): When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways.

(Side 2): For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known.

(ALL): And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

(Reader): Stay tuned for the continuing saga that is our story and God's story.






